Bachelor of Science in Community Health

Overview of the program

Communities the world over are faced with many health challenges that with appropriate knowledge and skills, could be solved at community level. This calls for community health workers who have the necessary knowledge, skill and competencies and refer health related conditions. The Bachelor of Science in Community Health seeks to train and equip Community health professionals who will work in the society to prevent and manage health problems at the lowest health levels all the way to national level.

Admission requirements

- a) A candidate who wishes to register must have the minimum University general admissions requirements.
- b) In addition to meeting (a) above, candidates wishing to register for Bachelor of Science in community health and development must have any of the following:

An aggregate score of at least C+ in Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) or equivalent qualifications, and at least C+ (Plus) in biology, English/Kiswahili and a C in two other sciences or humanities.

Or

c) A C constant and a diploma in community health

A) Duration of study

The course shall take a minimum of four years and a maximum of eight years. Each of the four academic years has two semesters and practicum shall be done during the trimester.
